## Typical errors in aesthetic judgments

**Illusion of thinking** in aesthetic judgment. [for example Nadirashvili and Dzidziguri]. The research participants were asked to evaluate a poem or a painting using a 5 point scale (-5 +5). The poem (painting) presented to the first group was attributed to a well known artist/poet. The material for the second group was attributed to an unknown person. The material presented to both groups was fully identical. The average assessment given by the first group was +4. The send group's average assessment was-4.

Just like with illusions of thinking, the basis for the typical errors in aesthetic judgments is the assimilation effect of the set underlying the process of thinking. It is a very common effect and is not followed by the illusion of contrast or objectification that could fix it. It is under the influence of conformity and stereotypes [see typical errors in moral judgments].
